

### Condom use

The data show that slightly more than two thirds of individuals ages 15-19 used a condom the last time they had intercourse. This is a troubling find as this left one third (33.8 %) of individuals in this age group unprotected from STIs including HIV/AIDS the last time they had intercourse.

As illustrated in Table 1, of those in the 15-19 age group, 39.8 percent had ever used a condom and 15.7 percent were currently using a condom, while 66.2 percent in that age group used a condom at last sex. In the 20-24 age group, 87 percent, 29.7 percent and 54.6 percent, had ever used a condom, were currently using a condom and used a condom at last sex respectively.
